The project will finance Mauritania's first large-scale battery energy storage facility, enabling the country to harness its abundant solar and wind resources for more reliable electricity.

Mauritania and France have signed a financial protocol to fund the construction of 10 dual solar power stations equipped with storage units, Mauritanian news agency (AMI) reported.

Mauritania became independent from France in 1960. The next 50 years were characterized by an authoritarian one-party regime, flawed elections, failed attempts at democracy and military coups.

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Mauritania will finance its first large-scale energy storage system to harness solar and wind power under efforts to achieve its 2030 universal energy access target.

Featuring an impressive 160 megawatts (MW) of solar power, 60 MW of wind energy, and a robust 370 megawatt-hours (MWh) battery storage, this project is not just a power plant; it's a ...
